Each verse gives a band and each word that begins with a capitalised letter is the first word of a song. Listing them out:

### **KISS**

- \* Black **D**iamond

- \* Rocket **R**ide

### **Rolling Stones**

- \* Emotional **R**escue
- \* Rocks **O**ff
- \* Miss **Y**ou
- \* Slipping **A**way
- \* Ivy **L**eague

### **Beatles**

- \* Little **C**hild
- \* Obladi **O**blada
- \* Lady **M**adonna
- \* Nowhere **M**an
- \* Back in the **U**SSR
- \* Good **N**ight
- \* Dig **I**t
- \* Little **C**hild
- \* One **A**fter 909
- \* Day **T**ripper
- \* Dig **I**t
- \* Glass **O**nion
- \* Good **N**ight

### **The Who**

- \* Latin **T**hing
- \* It's **H**ard
- \* Fiddle **A**bout
- \* One **N**ote
- \* Slip **K**id

The first letter of the last words form words themselves, which turn out to be the first words of Led Zeppelin songs.

### **Led Zeppelin**

- \* Dyer **M**aker
- \* Royal **O**rleans
- \* Communication **B**reakdown
- \* Thank **Y**ou

This now spells MOBY by the same token. It turns out that Led Zeppelin has a song called Moby Dick.
